

“Complexity” to Film in New Mexico

Santa Fe, N.M. – The original documentary television series “Complexity,” is Executive Produced by Misty Tosh of the New Mexico-based Dead Thief Outfit in association with Executive Producer Joe Livecchi of Noble Savages, and Executive Producer Leeandra Keany.

This 10-part series will explore the universe with scientists at the Santa Fe Institute, an iconoclastic research center that Rolling Stone magazine described as a “justice league of renegade geeks.”

Principal photography will begin in April and continue through October in Santa Fe, Albuquerque and Los Alamos.

The production will employ 10 New Mexico crew members.

The series will be hosted by Santa Fe Institute President David Krakauer, a renowned evolutionary biologist. It will feature a cast of researchers in settings that illuminate the culture and landscape of New Mexico, zooming out to reveal the unifying principles governing life, culture, and civilization. Each episode of “Complexity” will examine a different facet of complexity science and its use of quantitative tools for finding hidden order in evolving systems.

This New Mexico-based production will be the first series of its kind to really ask (and oftentimes answer) the Big Questions of the twenty-first century — what Stephen Hawking referred to as “the century of complexity.”
